



**2009-2010 E OLA PONO
COMPETITION GUIDELINES
Poster Art Entries for
Grades 4 - 6**

Aloha and welcome to the 2009-2010 *E Ola Pono* competition. Please follow the guidelines provided below to ensure that entries will be accepted by our judges. All work must be original creations by students currently enrolled in Grades 4 through 6; and produced during the period October 12th 2009 through March 25th 2010.

THEME: E OLA PONO: *Living with respect for everyone and in harmony with everything—PAST~PRESENT~FUTURE*

1. Follow the theme. Posters must include a theme title and caption. A theme title can be as simple as “E Ola Pono!” or more personal such as, “Helping My Grandpa Clean His Yard Is Pono”. Captions can incorporate *‘ōlelo no‘eau* (poetical Hawaiian sayings) or other well known anecdotal sayings (i.e., morals from Aesop’s fables), or famous quotes. Don’t forget to credit the source of the quote. If using a language other than English, please be sure to provide an English language translation.

2. Size. No smaller than 8-1/2 inches x 11 inches and no larger than 12 inches x 18 inches.

3. Media. Wax crayons, color pencils, color markers, water color and/or tempera paints. Please **DO NOT USE** oil pastels. Media can be a single selection or a combination of any/all listed above.

4. Criteria. Students must create their own drawings or paintings that express their personal interpretations of E OLA PONO. Please do not use lettering, animal, or character stencils; stickers; or other commercially produced items to trace shapes and forms. No collages or photographs.

5. Entry. Only one entry is allowed per student. Complete an entry form for each student and attach it to the poster with a paper clip or masking tape.

Note: Please ensure that students’ names are written on the reverse side of their posters.

6. JUDGING. See the Poster Art and Writing Rubrics that judges will use to score entries. These rubrics can be used as desired to guide student work.
