COMPETITION GUIDELINES

VIDEO GUIDELINES
GRADES 7-8

CONTEST THEME:

E OLA PONO: Living with respect for everyone and in harmony with everything—PAST~PRESENT~FUTURE

VIDEO GUIDELINES:

- Produce a 2-3 minute original video that defines and illustrates what Living Pono can mean
- Videos must be original work created only by students
- Genre or viewpoint is individual or production team's choice (i.e., past, present, future, or combination thereof, etc.)
- Stories based on interviews of others (i.e., elders, parents, practitioners, etc.) must have written permission from the storyteller (see entry form)
- All required forms must be fully completed and submitted together
- Each video production team may submit only one entry
- Teams may be students from different schools; each team must designate a sponsoring school or community group

VIDEO FORMAT, SPECIFICATIONS, REQUIREMENTS & LENGTH:

- 3 minute maximum
- 10 seconds of video black
- 5 second identifying slate with the category, title and school name
- 5 seconds of video black
- Start video entry
- NTSC 4:3 interlaced
- Time base 29.97 fps
- Frame size 720 X 480 (preferred)
- Audio 32/48kHz (48kHz preferred) 12/16 bit (16 bit preferred) stereo/mono (stereo preferred)
- File format: Choice of Mini DV tape (preferred) or Data DVD
- Only one entry submitted on each tape or disc

ALL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE:

- Completed Entry Forms (Teams complete one form for the group plus one for each team member)
- Video Category Release and Waiver Form(s)
- Copies of any necessary releases or licenses required to use third-party content
- Name of the student(s), school, grade(s), teacher's name, and video title on DVD or mini DV tape

Please note:

It is the entrant's responsibility to ensure all forms are completed and submitted; incomplete entries will be disqualified.

- Entries must be postmarked by March 25, 2010, or hand delivered to the CDS—UHM office by 2:00 p.m. that day.
- Judges selected by contest committee will pick the winning entries.
- Winners will be notified in May, 2010.
- Any entry may be incorporated into sponsors' curricula and publication projects.
